Questions about Application and Enrollment

IS LEGACY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL A STATE RAN PUBLIC SCHOOL?

A: LCS is a private ran Christian School. Because of our status as a private Christian school we are not a state ran public school. Based on guidelines in Illinois for private schools we are qualified by that state to provide quality Christian Education that meets or exceeds the level of our local state ran schools.

DO THE ACADEMIC AND EDUCATIONAL TRANSCRIPTS FROM LEGACY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL TRANSFER FROM OUR SCHOOL TO OTHER PUBLIC AND/OR PRIVATE SCHOOLS?

A: Yes. Because Legacy Christian School meets the standard of educational requirements in Illinois, all of our students will maintain official transcripts and credits during their time in our school. These transcripts are equal to, and hold the same credibility as those in any other state ran or private school

WHAT ARE YOUR ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS?

A: Admission is determined per individual student after completing the requirement enrollment application along with a screening test.

Questions About School Operations

WHAT TIME IS LEGACY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL OPEN?

A: School hours are Monday through Friday 8:30AM to 3:30PM. Drop Off hours are from 7:45AM-8:30AM, and school begins promptly at 8:30AM. School ends each day at 3:30PM.

DO YOU PROVIDE BEFORE AND AFTER-SCHOOL CARE?

A: Currently we provide after school care. This is offered from 3:30 PM – 5:00 PM.

DO THE STUDENTS WEAR UNIFORMS?

A: There is a modest and appropriate dress code for students and Staff of Legacy Christian School, however there is not a uniform issued at this time. This dress code is included in the student handbook that is received in the enrollment process.

DOES THE SCHOOL PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION?

A: Currently, transportation is not provided.

DO YOU OFFER LUNCH ON CAMPUS?

A: Lunch is available to purchase on a daily basis for an additional fee, it is not included in the tuition.

WHAT IS THE TUITION COST AT LEGACY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL?

A: Monthly tuition for Legacy Christian students is \$500 per student.

IS THERE A TUITION DISCOUNT FOR SIBLINGS?

A: No - currently each student enrolled will incur the same monthly tuition fee.

WHAT ARE THE ADMISSIONS RELATED FEES?

A: There is currently only a \$100 registration fee. There will be fees for books along with optional lunch purchases. Those will be discussed with families during the enrollment process.

ARE ALL OF LEGACY'S STAFF CHRISTIANS?

A: Yes, being a born again Christian and believer in the tenet of the Christian faith according to the Holy Scriptures is a prime prerequisite for Legacy Christian School's faculty and staff.

WHAT ARE THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR STAFF AT LEGACY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL?

A: Our staff meet the standards outlined by the State of Illinois for private run Christian Schools. While staff are not required to obtain a specific higher education degree under the state's guidelines, we do qualify each staff member based on their knowledge of the subjects being taught, and their ability to deliver the information to the students effectively. Our teachers use Bob Jones University Curriculum in all of our classes – this is a highly rated and effective educational curriculum that ensures that each child receives a quality education in our school.

DOES LEGACY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL OFFER EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES?

A: As a newly founded Private Christian School, LCS is placing our immediate focus on quality education inside the classroom. WHAT DOES LEGACY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL BELIEVE?

A: Legacy Christian School is dedicated to the instruction of children and young people in the light of the Bible, through which God directs us in our relationships and activities.

1. God – The Triune God who has revealed Himself in the Bible is sovereign as Creator and Sustainer of the universe and in love, redeems and purifies his people. All study at Legacy Christian must take Him into account, and He must be given first allegiance in our lives.
2. The Bible – The Bible is the infallible, authoritative Word of God through which God enlightens our understanding of Himself, of ourselves, of others, and of the world. Through His Word He also directs people in all their relationships and activities, and therefore guides them in the education of their children.
3. Creation – In their education, God's children must come to learn that the world and our calling in it can rightly be understood only in relation to God. We recognize that we are caretakers of this creation, holding it in trust for our Lord.
4. Sin – Human sin is radical and pervasive because every person is guilty of sin, and every person is wounded by the sin of others. Human sin causes us to be alienated from God and our neighbors. Sin disrupts the education of children by distorting our view of the true meaning and purpose of life, and misdirecting human culture.
5. Jesus Christ – Through Jesus Christ, God's Son, our sole Redeemer, all of life, including teaching and learning, takes on a new perspective. Christ's death on the cross paid the penalty for our sin, and His bodily resurrection ensures His followers of victory over sin, death, and hell. Christ is the Light and the Way for our life, so that we can be guided in truth and recommitted to love God and each other.
6. The Gospel – The Gospel is the good news that salvation is the free gift of God, through faith, not by our own works. Communication of the gospel is an important task that is best shared by the church, the home, and the school.
